In case you haven't yet heard, we have some new and newly revised accreditation resources now available in the **online resource library** specifically for programs and peer reviewers. In addition to new resources, we will also soon be rolling out a **new online resource library**. NAEYC's accreditation of early childhood higher education programs depends upon the commitment and professionalism of our volunteer peer reviewers and Commissioners.

The NAEYC Commission on Early Childhood Higher Education Accreditation is currently seeking to fill three seats with terms beginning January 1, 2025

and running through December 31, 2027. Wondering if this is a good fit for you? If you find yourself answering "yes" to the questions below, then view the full description of the Commission and the responsibilities of Commissioners.

- Are you passionate about ECE professional preparation program quality?
- Are you looking for a meaningful service opportunity that supports the ECE profession?
- Do you geek out over matters related to program evaluation and/or accreditation?
- Are you able to consume large quantities of reading without being overwhelmed?
- Do you like zooming in on small details AND zooming out to look at the big picture?
- Do you want to work with a group of people who value community, collegiality, robust discussions, and diverse perspectives?

In addition, applications to serve as a peer reviewer are currently being accepted through **September 30**. Becoming a higher education peer reviewer is an excellent way to learn more about this quality assurance system, as well as to give back to the early childhood field. Current or former full- or part-time early childhood faculty members who meet the qualifications are encouraged to apply! Qualified applicants will be invited to participate in an online training program. More information and the link to apply can be found on the **peer reviewer page of our website**.

Accreditation Policy Updates

If your program is preparing a *Response-to-Conditions report* (Year 1, 2, or 3) for conditions cited under the 2010 standards, fall 2024 is the final semester in which programs may choose to align key assessments with 2010 or 2020 standards; to include either five or six key assessments (for key assessment conditions); and to include or omit a learning opportunities chart (for submissions in the 2020 standards). Beginning in spring 2025, aligning key assessments to the 2020 standards, submitting six key assessments (for key assessment conditions), and submitting an updated learning opportunities chart (for programs that have key assessment alignment conditions) will be required. In many cases, including some or all of these updates even while they are still optional may make it easier for your program

to demonstrate that conditions have been met. This policy does not impact programs submitting a Response to Conditions for the September 30th deadline. Please reach out to staff at highered@naeyc.org with any questions about what may be required and/or advisable for your program.

To obtain the most benefit from the Commission review of **Year 4 Interim Reports**, programs submitting these reports are now **required** to align learning opportunities and key assessments with one of the 2020 Professional Standards and Competencies (it is OK if candidate performance data were collected from versions of assessments previously aligned with the 2010 standards).

Programs anticipating challenges submitting reports by their scheduled deadline may submit an extension request form in accordance with the extension policies found on pp.41-44 of the Accreditation Handbook.
